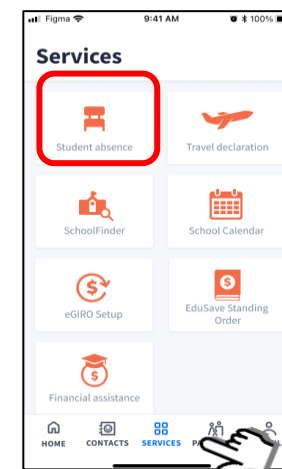
Absence Notification in Parents Gateway app

1. Submit child's reason for absence after receiving notification

- a) For child **without** medical certificate
- b) For child **with** medical certificate submission

2. Teacher's request to **follow-up on child's absence**

3. Parent to **submit absence without prompt from school** (Self-service link to submit child's absence)

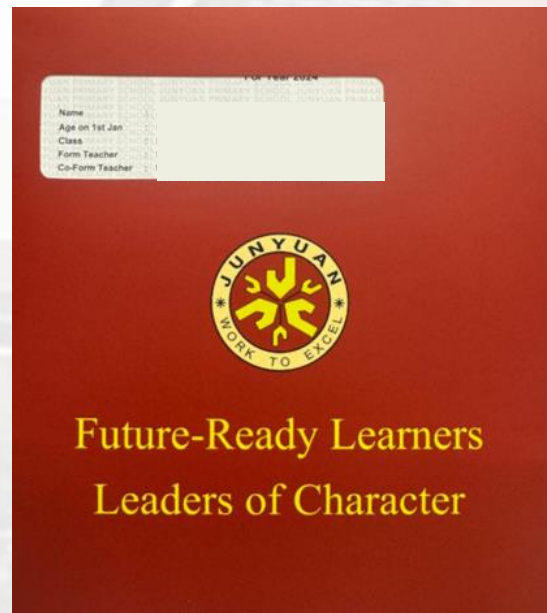
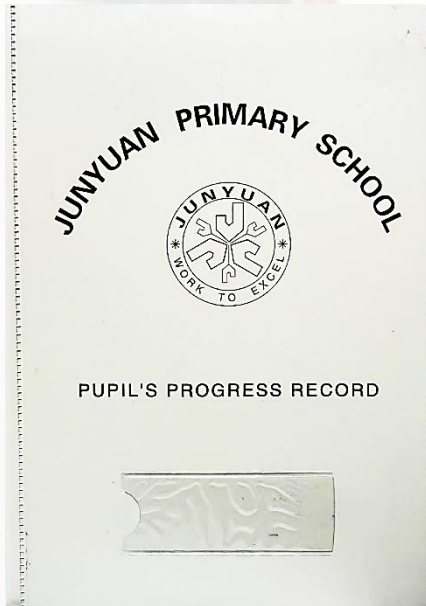

Qn 1: What is the grading system in Primary 3?

Qn 2: More insights on Gifted Education Programme (GEP)

Ans: GEP in its current form would be replaced with a refreshed approach to support High Ability Learners (HALs) from 2027. From 2026, Primary 3 students would take a centralised one-stage test in English and Mathematics. As per current practice, parents could choose to opt out. While the initial GEP screening test for English and Math will remain, the second-round selection test will be discontinued. Teachers will also have the flexibility to recommend students based on their day-to-day classroom performance, allowing late bloomers to join high-ability programmes from Primary 4 to 6.

Primary schools would have Tier 1 school-based provisions in place to stretch students in their areas of strength and interest such as E2K. Those who required further stretch could attend Tier 2 out-of-school advanced modules at nearby designated schools, known as Regional Centres (RCs).



Qn 3: Request of absence for any activities outside like international chess tournaments which is not part of CCA , how many days can be availed and how to cope up with the missing class?

Ans: As mentioned earlier in the PG SCM, parents will need to submit reasons for absence in PG with the number of days child is not in school and provide the supporting documents. There is no specified duration for such leaves, however, students are strongly encouraged to avoid non-essential travelling during curriculum time.

The subject teachers will try their best to catch-up with the students on topics that they have missed. Time allowance will be provided for the child to complete his/her work.
